## ***Port Aransas Outing Report***

On October 22nd and 23rd, we had our fall outing in Aransas Pass. About 26 fisher-gals enjoyed the weekend of fishing and kayaking.

The weekend started at the Ransom Rd RV park for our Mullet Mixer on Friday night. Lots of great appetizers were brought to share. Glenna Noret provided our new TWFF name tags for all of the 2004 members. Our guest speaker, Bill Harvey, was unable to join us for the weekend. We were fortunate to have Billy Trimble step in for him and provide us with great information on fishing the flats. Billy went through organizing equipment we need in our kayaks, how to get positioned on the flats to find and see redfish, where to cast, and strategies to beat the wind using a fly rod. Billy did a great job on his presentation and getting us ready for Saturday morning. We all went to sleep with visions of redfish tails in our heads!

Our fishing day on Saturday started at dawn. Due to the predicted strong winds, we fished the "Brown and Root" flats on the south side of the causeway instead of the Lighthouse Lakes. Stacy Trimble, and Dean Thomas, Slowride Guide Service, met us with two other guides, Ken and Scott and to help us with our rather large group. By 7:45, all the kayaks were launched and paddling into the flats began. The four groups of fishers went to different areas in the flats. We all saw lots of schooling mullet as we paddled out, with lots of anticipation to see some tailing reds. Sheila Anderson, with Scott's group heading west, caught the first redfish at 8:45. Kerri Stephenson caught an 18" mullet with Scott as well. Betty Burleson also caught an 18" mullet with Stacy. Her group went east towards Port A along some oyster reefs and saw tails later in the morning. By mid morning the tide went slack, the wind picked up and the fish were scarce. We came back to the launch area wiser in our understanding of fishing the flats.

Saturday night, we headed across channel on the ferry to Port Aransas. We had a great seafood dinner at the Crazy Cajun. We had lots of fun with piles of seafood poured on our tables and pitchers of beer brought to wash down the spicy food. Our entertainment, a one-man band with an accordion and harmonica had fun with our group playing as many fishing songs that he could muster. An enjoyable outing for all at the Coast!

**THE PLAN-** is to make this a mostly Fly tying outing due to the nature of the weather during January. There have been several people who have requested classes and it is a good time to do that if we can't get outside. Coco Davenport and Linda Love have graciously volunteered to hold classes. We also have a feature fly tier or two lined up to teach us how to make some really fancy flies. There will be tying kits available for our use thanks to the Texas Parks and Wildlife Education Department. If you have your own fly tying kits please be sure and bring it and if you have an extra you are willing to share please do so.

**FISHING-** Since we plan for bad weather perhaps we will be surprised by the sunshine and can do some fishing. Bring your rod and enjoy some good ol' fishing along the banks of Bastrop and

Buescher State Park Lake. If you can't reach them from the bank, you can rent one of the canoes (10.00 @ day-right by the lake) or bring your kayak and relax out in the open waters. The Bastrop Lake has a small lake that has perch, crappie, bass and catfish. The Buescher Lake is scheduled to be stocked December 16, 2004 by TP&W with trout. Weather permitting, Ronnie Ray, will be giving casting lessons on Saturday @ 9:00 am and 1:00pm or to be determined by the weather.

This is the outing to bring all your friends and family because WE WILL HAVE ROOM and they will love you if they join and win a Thomas & Thomas rod. We will be staying at the Group facilities at the Bastrop State Park. The facilities are used for Church groups and family reunions. They are the best value but the accommodations are best described as rustic and plain. There are 4 cabins that sleep 22 people dorm style for a total of 88 people. There will be a Men's cabin for those whose husbands and sons wish to attend. The area has it's own bathhouse that accommodates Men/Women each side 3 stalls and 2 showers. The Group area has it's own day use area that is approx. 3-4 acres with picnic tables and a large fire ring and a hiking trail that heads there. In addition to the "dorms" there is a kitchen/dining facility. The dining hall is really large so it will easily accommodate all people in the event we have inclement weather. In addition, there is plenty of room for class tying tables and dining tables. The kitchen is huge and it has a commercial 8 burner stove and 2 commercial size cooler/refrig. The price is excellent but it is SO NOT like the place we have been staying on the Guadalupe, however, our chances for learning to tie flies, catch fish and having "together" time should be high. BE SURE AND BRING COMFORTABLE CHAIRS OR YOU WILL BE SITTING ON PICNIC STYLE TABLES ALL WEEKEND.
